Medicine Division

Our medical division offers a comprehensive range of acute inpatient and outpatient services. Our general medical wards provide specialist care:

- two respiratory wards with eight designated acute respiratory beds
- gastroenterology
- oncology medicine
- renal
- endocrine
- three older people medical wards
- frailty unit
- acute stroke unit
- stroke rehabilitation ward
- dermatology day unit serving South Essex

We also have:

- two renal units
- endoscopy department

The morning session is focused on learning radiological and EBUS mediastinal mapping, indications for linear EBUS-TBNA, art of performing the EBUS, complications, risks and cytopathologic diagnosis (including ROSE).
Attendees will also gain knowledge of the role of mediastinoscopy, autofluorescopy, bronchoscopy and early lung cancer detection and have an introduction to the art of airway tumour debulking.

The afternoon session will have a live EBUS-TBNA demonstration and the attendees will have plenty of hands-on experience of handling EBUS-TBNA scope and opportunities to practice simulator, ROSE, radiology and LN station and needle sampling technique.

About the day

The morning session will offer an introduction to various flexible bronchoscopic interventional techniques to treat airways tumour, stricture, perform medical lung volume reduction, bronchial thermoplasty in treating chronic asthma, cryotherapy debulking and TBLS in ILO.
The role of radial EBUS in diagnosis of SPN, and evolving future treatments in treating lung cancer such as microwave ablation, the role of PDT in early lung cancer and brachytherapy will be discussed.

This session will also cover rigid bronchoscopy skills, laser Yg debulking and endobronchial valves.

The afternoon will provide candidates with ample opportunity to familiarise themselves with the interventional techniques involved.

The hands-on sessions will include EBUS, R-EBUS, cryotherapy, diathermy/APC, rigid bronchoscopy, stenting, electromagnetic navigation, bronchial thermoplasty and endobronchial valves.

By road
From A170 Take the A176 turn off (Five Bells roundabout). Take the Basildon exit (follow the hospital A&E sign). Continue on this road. Basildon University Hospital is on your left hand side.
From A130 Take the Basildon (A176) turn off towards Basildon town centre. The route to the hospital is clearly marked with red hospital A&E signs.
From A102 Take the A130 turn off towards Basildon. Continue on A130 until it merges onto the A13. Take the A176 turn off (Five Bells roundabout). Take the Basildon exit (follow the hospital A&E sign). Continue on this road. Basildon University Hospital is on your left hand side.

By train

Stoptober

Stoptober, the 28-day stop smoking campaign from Public Health England is back. The campaign has driven over one million quit attempts to date and is the biggest mass quit attempt in the country. It's based on research that shows if you can stop smoking for 28 days, you are five times more likely to stay smoke free for good. Public Health England have highlighted three reasons to give up smoking: feel healthier, save money and protect your family.

There are lots of ways to give up smoking. We need to ensure we're screening all patients to establish if they smoke and offer help and advice. It's important to include the wider medical team in this process so doctors can talk patients through the different nicotine replacement therapies available. Crucially, we must ensure we document our stop smoking screening processes in notes.
